On Monday 5th February, ECP will also deliver online safety workshops to all classes (Reception to Year 6) and a twilight training session for all staff.

From behaviour and attendance to learning outcomes, research shows the real benefits of parents and carers engaged in their children's learning. We believe that the more informed parents and carers are about the curriculum and the ways we teach at EHA, the better prepared you are to support your child at home. This directly links to how well your child does at school and how confident they feel about their learning.

To support you as parents and carers, we have prepared a programme of coffee mornings, workshops and information meetings (Phonics, Tapestry, Maths and Reading, Healthy lifestyles, Attendance and behaviour, SEND, etc) and we are committed to continue with more.

However, we DO ASK for your PARTICIPATION and ATTENDENCE at the sessions. I know that the top barrier to parents getting more involved in school life remains time and I understand that not all the sessions will be fully attended. But it was very sad to learn that not a single parent/carer turned up to Maths Workshop for Year 5 and 6 last Tuesday morning. Mrs Ubor, our Maths Lead and Mrs Tilley, our Maths Consultant prepared an excellent crash course of everything you need to know to help your child be a successful mathematician. We will continue sending reminder texts via Arbor to alert parents and carers to coffee morning and events we are running as well as announcing them via news round letters in good time for you to save dates in your diary.
