History

- Introduction to football.
- Discussions on impact of football.
- Introduction on Walter Tull.

- What have Tull and Kane achieved? Comparison of their lives and impact.

Art

- Introduction to what is a collage
- To begin to learn and practise a variety of techniques.

- Explore work of other artists Andy Warhol style prints of Walter Tull and Harry Kane.

Maths

- Place Value: identify, represent and estimate numbers using different representations.
- Mental addition and subtraction: Count from 0 in multiples of 4,8,50 and 100 find 10 or 100 more or less than a given number.
- Written addition and subtraction: add and subtract numbers with up to three digits, using formal written methods of columnar addition and subtraction.
- Bar charts: Interpret and present data using bar charts, pictograms and tables.
- Geometry: Measure the perimeter of simple 2D shapes, identify right angles in shapes, identify acute and obtuse angles.
- Shape (2D and 3D) recognise, 2D and 3D shapes, identify properties of 3D shapes, to make 3D shapes using nets.

Music: explore a range of songs from different cultures that are sung at football and other sporting events, including *Waka Waka, Ole Ole, It's Coming Home* and *Oh Africa*. They will also play a simple instrumental accompaniment for some of these songs.
