SEN concerns should be directed via office email for the attention of Mrs Radmore (Senco) and Ms Monaghan (Sen Consultant). They will pick the emails up on the days that they are working at EHA. Mrs Radmore works on Mondays and Wednesdays; Ms Monagham is here on Wednesdays, and till the end of this half term, also on Thursdays.

Good attendance is considered to be **96%** and above but please be aware that each day is made up of two sessions, morning and afternoon, and so 2 days


absence can soon drop attendance down to 98%.
