With confident voices and undeniable facts, they dismantled common misconceptions, highlighting that training—not restriction—creates well-behaved dogs. From comparing leash laws to unnecessary control, to proving that offlead dogs are happier, healthier, and less aggressive, our team left the judges—and the audience—completely captivated.

They tackled tough counterarguments, debunked breed stereotypes, and even added humour to their battle of words. And most importantly? They smiled. Their personalities shone through, making their victory not just about winning—but about owning the stage. The EHA conclusion was the only school that left the audience clapping and cheering in their final words before it even finished.
