Attendance and Punctuality

Our goal is for every child to be in school every day, arriving on time ready for an 8.45am start. In line with government expectations, we will continue to monitor pupil attendance and offer our support where attendance is beginning to drop.

Good attendance is considered to be **96%** and above but please be aware that each day is made up of two sessions, morning and afternoon, and so 2 days absence can soon drop attendance down to 98%.

We know that illness is part of everyday life but we require medical certification to authorise absence. We are also aware that some learners struggle to come to school, have had reduced timetables to settle into their first year of school or strategies in place to help them cope. This is all taken into account. If you are needing any help or support with helping your child to attend school, please do get in touch so that we can support you. We apply the following escalation in regards of attendance. **Mr Venn, DHT** who is our Attendance lead, and **Mrs Bharmal, School Support Manager,** who is our Attendance officer track attendance and engage with families when concerns arise supported by **Mel Madahar, our Trust EWO** (Education Welfare Officer).
