Reception

This half term, Reception Class has been learning about 'Under the Sea Creatures' and 'Life'. They have explored what life was like under the sea as well as comparing sea life to other forms of life found in different place, eg. deserts, forests and grasslands.

In English, they retold and wrote the stories of 'Sharing a Shell', 'Commotion in the Ocean' and 'Rainbow fish,' by using the technique Fundamental Five (story openers: once upon a time, one day, unfortunately, luckily and eventually). Using this technique, the children were able to build sentences of the story orally within a group. In Maths, the children developed their skills in doubling numbers, learning their number Bonds to 10, as well as one more and one less than a given number. They also practise position using language such as 'in, up, under and down'. The children also explored and enjoyed measuring capacity.

In Science lessons, they were able to compare the different animal habitats: 'deserts, forests, grasslands and mountains'. In PSHE, they learned about different body-parts: eg. eye, knee, ear, finger, foot, stomach, eyebrow, arm, tongue and toe). Additionally, they learned how to recycle, and we look after our school/playground environment. They discovered the different bins we have around school and what they are for.

Art and DT tied together beautifully, with children designing their own sun hat. They also created a summer scene for collage using things would you see in summer. They were able to use different materials and fabrics to create flowers, birds and ice-cream.



Year 1

In maths this half term, Year 1 have been learning to tell the time and the importance of it. We have been putting events in time order, using a number line to understand how time works, and we have made clocks. The children were introduced to the minute hand and o'clock and half past. They had



fun reasoning about time and discussing whether it we would measure in seconds, minutes or hours when walking to school, having our breakfast or writing our name.

In English, we have been working hard on our storybook The three little pigs and the big bad wolf. Children took part in role-play acting out the different parts of the story. We innovated our own version of the story in which we changed the way the way the pigs tricked the wolf. We focused on speech and using 'but' to compare the pigs and the wolf. Children also designed a 'wanted' poster as the wolf went missing, including lots of adjectives to describe the wolf's character and personality.

In learning journey this half term, the children have been learning all about the local area. We went on a walk to identify the physical and human features around us. Children then created a messy map of our local area using blocks. We then compared our local area to a small town looking carefully at the similarities and differences. Children were introduced to google maps and observed the school structure in aerial view.



Year 2

What a fantastic term it has been! In English, the children explored the magical world of Peter Pan and created their own endings to the story. Using rich vocabulary and exciting punctuation, they wrote creative tales featuring characters like Spiderman, Evil Pea, Princess Anna, Traction Man and Venom. Their imaginations truly shone through!

In Maths, we spent time strengthening our skills in addition and subtraction and took on the challenge of telling the time to the nearest five minutes. The children really enjoyed the hands-on activities—especially building their own clocks using Cuisenaire rods and Numicon, which helped them understand how time works in a fun, practical way.

Our Geography lessons took us across the islands of the United Kingdom and over to Trinidad and Tobago. We compared things like weather, housing, physical and human features, and surrounding



bodies of water. The highlight had to be our Caribbean-themed day at Enfield Heights Academy. Another big highlight this term was our class trip to the Natural History Museum. It was a brilliant way to consolidate so much of our learning and the children were absolutely fascinated by the exhibits.

In DT, we took on a very tasty challenge: designing and making sandwiches for Miss Michael! The children started by interviewing her to find out about her likes, dislikes and any allergies. Then they got to work, carefully planning their sandwich creations. They practised all sorts of food prep skills—cutting, slicing, grating, mashing, peeling, and spreading—and the final results were fantastic. Miss Michael was very impressed!



Year 3

This half term, Year 3 has been on an exciting journey through Ancient Greece. They've explored what life was like in Athens and Sparta, delving into the origins of democracy, the roles of slaves, and the power of myths and legends. The children compared life then to now, reflecting on how things have changed—and what has stayed the same!

In English, the children studied Shakespeare's A Midsummer Night's Dream, enjoying the comedy and relationships between characters. They wrote and performed their own playscripts, imagining what might happen on the characters' wedding day, using expanded noun phrases, similes, and emotive language.

In maths, children developed skills across fractions, time, statistics, and geometry. They added and subtracted fractions with the same denominator, told time to the nearest five minutes on analogue and digital clocks, and interpreted data in tables and bar charts.

Science lessons focused on Animals Including Humans. Pupils explored nutrition, created healthy meal plans, and studied the skeleton and muscles through hands-on activities like reconstructing a life-sized skeleton.

In Spanish, they explored Mexican culture through food, traditional dress, and music, even learning to sing 'La Bamba'! They combined this with vocabulary around colours and dates. They also engaged in performance through music, learned golf and teamwork skills in PE, and discussed physical and emotional changes in PSHE. Art and DT tied together beautifully, with pupils designing and building clay pots supported by shell structures they engineered themselves.

What a half term of learning, discovery and creativity!





Year 4

This term, Year 4 have explored numbers and operations in greater depth. We've built our understanding of place value and practised written and mental methods for addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division. We've used the inverse operation to check our work and solved multistep word problems using bar models to show our thinking. We also developed our time skills by reading timetables and solving real-life time problems.

In English, we focused on suspense writing, using Chaperon Rouge with a twist to create spooky, mysterious stories. We learned how to build tension through word choice, sentence structure and setting. Our stories included brave characters, creepy forests, and clever endings. We also explored poetry, writing and performing imaginative pieces that used sound, rhythm, and actions to entertain our audience.

In science, we investigated sound. We explored how it travels through solids, liquids, and gases, and observed vibrations in everyday objects. Our experiments included using string telephones and creating simple musical instruments. We tested how pitch and volume can change depending on the size or tightness of materials.

In geography, we studied Madrid and London, comparing their physical and human features. We looked at maps, landmarks, climate, and population. We discussed what makes each city unique and considered where we would prefer to live and why. In art, we were inspired by designer Paco Rabanne. We became fashion designers ourselves, creating outfits from everyday materials like foil, paper, and plastic. We finished the unit with a fun and colourful fashion show to celebrate our work.

To celebrate all our fantastic learning this year, we went on a fun trip to the Natural History Museum. The children were excited to spot things they had learned about in science, geography, and English. They asked great questions, explored the exhibits, and showed how much they've remembered. It was a brilliant way to end a year full of hard work.





Year 5

This Summer term, Year 5 have cemented their understanding of the four operations: addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. They have gleaned a more profound understanding of the algorithms associated with these operations. They also had the opportunity to develop their skillset in problem solving involving these operations. The interrelatedness between decimals, percentages and fractions was explored and they have learned to convert between these concepts. They have also explored fractions in greater depth: converting between mixed number and improper fractions. Further work was done in measurement, where the children developed their understanding of converting between different units of measure.

In English, we have used a Literacy Shed video "Francis" to stimulate the writing of a suspense narrative. Our learning explored characterisation and themes within the storyline. There was a strong focus on setting and the use of pathetic fallacy and personification to create suspense. In addition, we used the video as further stimuli for the writing of a newspaper report. We have been able to identify both the structural and grammatical features of a newspaper report. Throughout this term children were exposed to the use of subordinating conjunctions, modal verbs, adverbials of time and relative clauses to develop their sentence structures.

In science we have been immersed into the Enfield Schools Partnership STEM project which culminated in a science fair on 8th July. The children employed various scientific skills; plan, observe, record, analyse and evaluate throughout the development of what became some absolute masterpieces. On the day of the fair, judges were extremely impressed which led to maximum scores for some of our presentation and teamwork. We also studied Forces alongside our STEM project. In History we explored the Ancient Egyptians through the big question: Who were the most advanced people- Early Britons or the Ancient Egyptians?







Year 6

In maths, year 6 started the half term with a focus on algebra. Here, we built a foundational understanding of algebraic equations and formulas by studying function machines, and how an operation affects an input to create an output. We then moved onto the study of ratio and proportion. Children learnt how to scale recipes and the sizes of shapes by a scale factor.

In English lessons, we have written a short poem based on 'The British' by Benjamin Zephaniah. In this poem, children wrote about the diverse ingredients required to build a certain aspect of their life that is important to them.

In science we have been studying our 'animals including humans' unit – specifically focusing on the circulatory system and cardiovascular health. Children have conducted a variety of different comparative studies into how exercise affects heart rate, as well as changing the type of exercise (independent variable) to assess how different intensities of exercise lead to different results.

As parents/carers of year 6 children will know, one of the most exciting projects this half term was the end of year production. In preparation for this, pupils worked incredibly hard to learn their lines and develop their choreography, singing and acting skills. Children in year 6 also designed and created all the props that were used to bring the show to life. At Heights, we are very proud of the show that our students were able to perform to the whole school, and their families.

EHA's Got Talent!

What talent we have in EHA. From the first round, through to the semi-final to the final, we were all treated to an array of wonderful performances, including singing, dancing, gymnastics and magic! Sports Days!

SATs, Multiplication Timestable Check and Phonics results

What a fantastic achievement! The children in Enfield Heights are going from strength to strength.

Year 6 performed incredibly in their SATs – achieving our highest ever results, with a whopping 93% combined in reading, writing and maths.

Year 4 performed excellently in their Multiplication Timestable Check – earning an average score of 23 out of 25, with 62% of the class scoring full marks!

Year 1 and 2 performed superbly in the Phonics screening assessments this year, with 96% passing in Year 1 and re-sit children in school all passing.


Farewell Year 6
