Maths

Children will learn how to read, write, order and compare numbers to 1 million. They will also develop their ability to round any number to the correct degree of accuracy.

We will then be working the four operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division) involving integers, fractions and decimals

English

Reading:

In whole class reading, children, will be exploring a variety of text types designed to capture their interest and develop their comprehension ability.

Writing:

Narrative recount: Children will write a narrative recount based on a short video from the Jurassic World movie. They will integrate narrative techniques including expanded noun phrases, dialogue to convey character and relative clauses. This recount will start to develop children's ability to build suspense and tension.

Newspaper article: Following on from their narrative recount, children will write their first non-fiction piece of the year, focusing on writing in a formal register and incorporating the passive voice. This article will focus on the events of the video and require children to alter their vocabulary choices for the purpose.

Music

Children will be exploring musical traditions and their history. They will explore features of diembe drumming, performing as an ensemble. They will then learn how to play polvrhythms.
