Force for positive change:

This term children will be learning about how toys and colours are not stereotyped.

They will explore celebrations of festivals that are as authentic as possible and how all religions are treated with equal concern.

Maths

Children will learn to:

Addition and subtraction

- count backwards from 20 to 0 from any given number.
- -Adding and subtracting numbers using concrete objects.
- -Finding number bonds from 0 to 10.
- -Solve one step problems that involve addition and subtraction.
- -Tell the time to the nearest hour.

Multiplication and division

- count in steps of 2 up to 20.

English

Reading: In guided reading, children, will be exploring a variety of text types designed to capture their interest and develop their comprehension ability.

Writing:

<u>Fantasy Narrative</u>: Children will write a fantasy narrative using 'and' as a conjunction and focusing on capital letters and full stops.

<u>Non-fiction</u>: Children will write a report based on the trashed classroom using simple sentences and sentence starters.

<u>Poetry</u>: Children will experiment with key vocabulary using adjectives to describe their own toy.

Music

This term, the children will learn songs and deliver a mini concert. They will learn to play a simple instrument part, such as glockenspiel or chime bar.



PSHE: Celebrating

Difference

Children will be learning about understanding that we are different, and these differences make us all special and unique. They will explore friendships and bullying.

Physical Education

PE -Outdoor - Games Attack v Defence

Children will focus on improving participation in team's games,

developing simple tactics for attacking and defending.

They will apply simple principles with a particular focus on creating simple tactics to win the game.

PE- Indoor - Gymnastics

Children will develop movement and balance using various body parts and begin linking actions using champion gymnastics techniques. They will explore and understand different types of movement, showing creativity in how they connect them, through travelling and balancing techniques.

<u>History</u>

Children will be learning about the difference between past and present in their own and others' lives. They will be comparing old and new toys as well as looking at the key figures Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin during the Moon Landing.



RE: Christianity

The children will be learning about the story of Christmas and where baby Jesus was born. They will learn about the disciples who visited him and the importance of gifts to

Christians. We will discuss how some Christians prepare for Christmas and talk about the belief that Jesus is God's son, given to the world.

Art: colours



Children will practise using primary colours to make secondary colours, looking at how colours can be changed through tinting and shading.

Spanish

This term, the children will be counting to ten and recognising and saying body parts including facial features.

Geography: opportunity

The children will deepen their understanding of the United Kingdom and the countries within it. They will locate the UK on a map of the world and identify the different compass points. They will use the compass points to follow directions.



Science: Materials

This term children will be learning about different types of materials. They will be identifying and naming everyday materials including wood, plastic, glass, metal, water, rock. They will begin to look at the basic physical properties of these materials including absorbency and whether they are waterproof or not. Children will also suggest a suitable use for a material.
