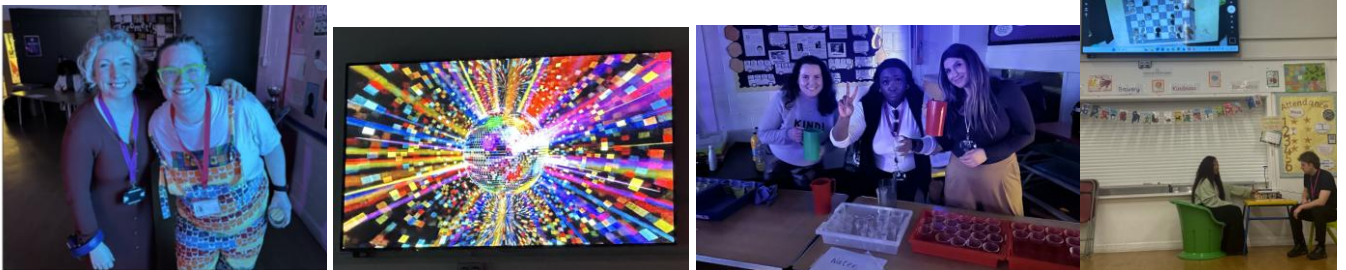
Dear Parents and Carers,

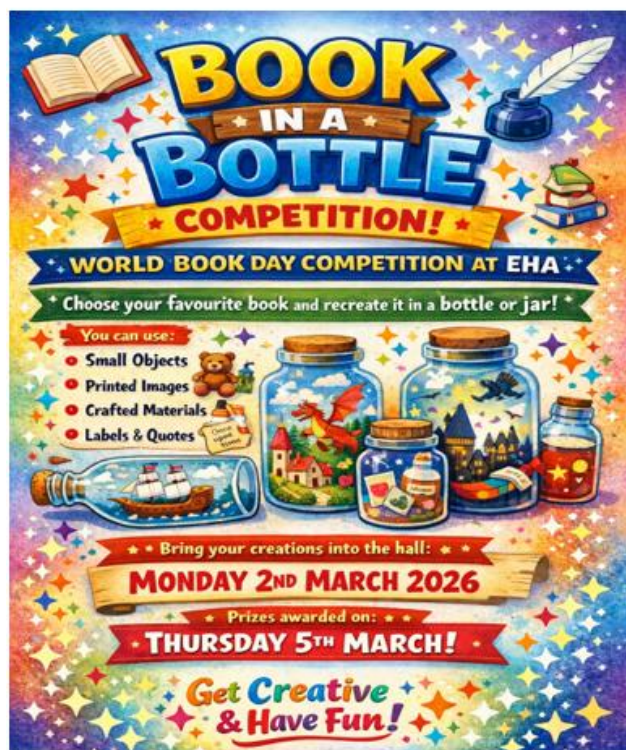


Delicious Treat
