Dear Parents/Carers

We are celebrating British Science Week between the **9<sup>th</sup> and the 13<sup>th</sup> of March 2026**. This week is a celebration of **Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM)**. This year's theme is **'What's your question?'** and offers all children a chance to explore a variety of scientific curiosities.

During the week, children will:

1. Take part in a 'Guess Who? Scavenger hunt' for a person in STEM. Learning about the person's achievements and impact on today.



2. Years 2-6 will take part in a national online science investigation



3. On **Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> March**, every class will take part in **'Enquiry Day'** where they will carry out an enquiry investigation and share their findings. We invite your child to dress up as a **person in STEM**. This could be an engineer, a mechanic, a scientist or a mathematician.



The day will start with an introductory assembly and then children will spend the rest of the day exploring a variety of scientific enquiries, such as, "Does toast always land butter side down?"

4. They will also all have the opportunity to enter a national science week poster competition showcasing their views on: [What are children and young people's visions for a good/ positive childhood?](#) Children will be able to complete their posters at home with a school deadline of **Monday 13<sup>th</sup> April**, so we can submit entries. Further information will be shared on Google classroom when the competition is launched.
