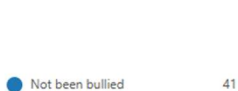

- **16 comments left (with 1 suggestion for improvement)**

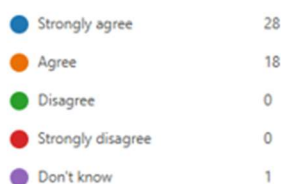

Thank you for your support and feedback. I shared your comments and scores with the staff and will be sharing the results of the survey with the children too.

We considered your suggestion of opening the gates earlier, but it is unfortunately not possible to operationally staff it as teams are preparing for the day full of learning. We open gates on time and SLT and staff are present at both Palmers Gate as well as Pitfield Way gate if you require any assistance.

We also continually request that parents do not drive and drop children holding up traffic or park on pavements. We report instances to the council and have requested the presence of traffic wardens to support the school. It is their responsibility to ensure safety and compliance. However, we actively speak to parents/carers to make them aware of the impact of their actions. We kindly ask that the whole of our school community respects this and ensures that children are safe and happy to start the school day. Our School Council will be writing to Enfield Council Transport Department shortly.

Enfield Heights' Got Talent- our 2nd edition

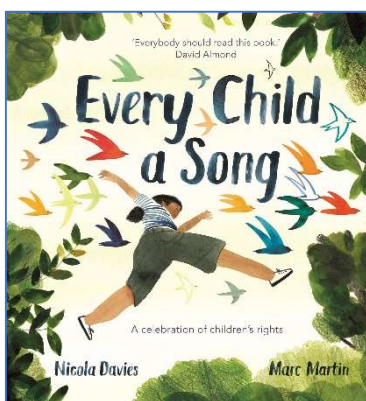
