English

Short stories – in this unit, children will emulate the concepts explored in a selection of ‘500-word story’ entries. They will use a variety of different grammatical features depending on the text type they are writing. These short stories will evidence the progress that year 6 pupils have made through their journey in KS2.

Script writing - Macbeth

Whilst practising for their end of year production, children will be more comfortable with the structure and grammatical features of scripts. In this unit, they will practise writing their own scripts based on Macbeth.

RE

Buddhism – Pupils will study how Theravada and Mahayana Buddhists put their beliefs into action. They will also learn about the eightfold path and why it is important to some Buddhists.

Music

This half-term, the focus of music sessions will be to practise the lyrics and performances required for the musical numbers in the year 6 production. Pupils will perform in small groups, whole class and, in some cases, solos.

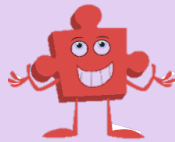
Computing

Children will develop their functional thinking and coding skills.

PHSE:

Changing me

Children will begin the unit by studying the concept of a ‘self-image.’ Children will learn about how girls’ and boys’ bodies change during puberty, the journey from conception to birth, adolescent friendships and how they can prepare for the year ahead at secondary school.



Physical Education

PE –Outdoor – Tri-golf

Children will learn skills to accurately hit the ball and get it into the hole in as few shots as possible. They will learn how to play a variety of golf rules, including: scramble, best ball and alternate shots.

Spanish



The children will recognise and locate Spanish speaking countries around the world. They will then focus on Cuba, identifying facts and different aspects of their culture. Finally, pupils will study specific Cuban festivals and traditions.

DT

Children will be looking at the use of cam mechanisms in the current market. Children will then try to recreate their own cam mechanism and begin brainstorming design ideas based around the use of a cam mechanism.

Science: Animals including Humans

Children will be learning about the main parts of the human circulatory system. They will be developing their knowledge on how the heart, blood vessels and blood function. Children will also be learning about the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on the human body. Children will investigate the life cycle of a human from birth to old age.

Art Opportunity

Children will have the opportunity to use and hone their art skills through their use of sculpture.

Geography Opportunity

Children will revise and develop their map skills to locate Earth’s natural resources
